




Copperhead

IDENTIFICATION OF PIT VIPERS

(Rattlesnakes, Copperhead, Cottonmouth)

Large triangular head, pupils elliptical, sensory pit between nostril and eye



Cottonmouth/Water Moccasin




Coral Snake

IDENTIFICATION OF

Red and yellow rings touch (every other ring yellow).

Similar non-venomous species, such as the Scarlet King Snake, have red and black rings touching (every other ring black) & can be confused with the Coral Snake.



Scarlet King Snake



- ✓ Remove jewelry or tight clothes covering bitten extremity.
- Immobilize extremity if possible.
- ✓ Keep bitten area at or below heart level.
- Wash gently.
- ✓ Seek medical attention as soon as
- ✓ Be prepared to treat for shock.



Call the Florida Poison Information Center Network for immediate assistance with any snake bite.



- ¥ Feed the victim.
- ★ Make cuts around bitten area.
- ★ Place ice on bitten extremity.
- X Apply a tourniquet.
