

When working with pesticides, wear:

- Rubber or latex gloves. Do not use cloth or leather gloves.
- Safety goggles or glasses
- Mask over nose and mouth
- Long pants and sleeves
- Boots or shoes with socks

Wash skin or shower as soon as possible after use.



Remove contaminated clothes before entering living spaces and wash separate from other clothing.

First Aid

- Get into fresh air.
- · Remove clothes if soiled.
- Flush eyes and skin with cool water.
- If swallowed do NOT force vomiting.
- Contact Poison Control if you have been exposed to pesticides or are showing signs of pesticide poisoning.

Safe Practices

Proper Storage







- <u>Disinfectants</u>: Antimicrobials or bleach
- Herbicides: Weed killers
- <u>Fungicides</u>: Mildew, algae, and fungus removers
- <u>Insecticides</u>: Insect repellents and foggers
- Rodenticides: Rat or mice killers

Products may be sprays, liquids, balls, pellets, powders, crystals, or foggers.



- Always check the label for directions on appropriate use.
- Do not mix with other chemicals.
- Check weather conditions before spraying outdoors.
- Never leave pesticides or equipment unattended.

Do not spray near children, pets, toys, or eating areas.

- Keep pesticides closed in their original container
- Store up high and out of reach of children or pets.
- Keep in locked cabinet.
- Store in a cool, dry area, away from heat and away from food.

Safe Disposal

Do not pour down drains.



Follow label instructions for proper disposal.
